1. Training Topic:	Safe use of pesticides

3. Course Summary	Dr. S. B. Das addressed participants on the proper use of pesticides and how they are harmful to both pests and humans. They don't have to be dangerous to humans or non-target animal species if proper measures are followed. They also talk about how pesticides can have negative consequences if they are consumed, either purposefully or accidentally, or if they come into touch with the skin over an extended period of time. While being sprayed, pesticide particles might be swallowed through the air. Contamination of drinking water, food, or soil is another danger.		
4. Sum – up Discussion with participants	During the programme, participants were taught how to handle pesticides safely in an integrated manner through a CBT session. Then, during the conversation, a number of them raised questions about methodology, techniques, and examples. Participants also had questions about different pesticides and its safety, which Dr. S. B. Das answered satisfactorily. Overall, the students found the instruction to be quite beneficial and effective.

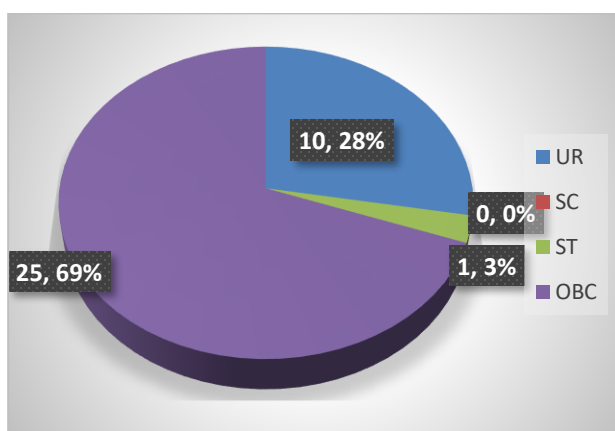
